

A Message from the Security Committee

Since January of this year, Stoney Brook has had five homes broken into. Burglaries were successful in two of these, and possibly a third, where it is still unknown if any thing was taken.

On Wednesday, April 25th, members of the Board met with Officer Tony Burkhardt, our neighborhood police officer, to discuss these incidents. Below are his and the Denver Police Department's recommendations for home security:

1. Security doors are a must. Then be certain to keep them locked all the time.
2. Patio and kitchen doors should have heavy-duty deadbolts with one-inch throw bolts into the doorframe.
3. Burglar alarms in all houses and arm them.
4. Garage doors should be closed at all times.
5. Front lights turned on all night.
6. Patio lights turned on all night or install motion detector lights.
7. Neighbors need to be aware and alert to what is going on in their area.
8. Make your home look as though someone is at home, even when you actually are home. Turn on interior lights, TV or radio, and set them on timers when you are gone.

On June 7 at 7:00 pm., Officer Burkhardt of the Denver Police will be at the Stoney Brook Clubhouse for a meeting with all Stoney Brook residents to discuss the above and other security concerns. Please, plan on attending.
